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### **Recall of Raw Beef Products due to Possible Salmonella Newport Contamination.**

#### **Report from the USDA (US Department of Agriculture)**

**WASHINGTON, Dec. 4, 2018** – JBS Tolleson, Inc., a Tolleson, Ariz. establishment, is recalling approximately **12,093,271 pounds of non-intact raw beef products that may be contaminated with *Salmonella* Newport**, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) announced today. The raw, non-intact beef items, including ground beef, were packaged on various dates from July 26, 2018 to Sept. 7, 2018.

Consumers who have purchased these products are urged not to consume them. These products should be thrown away or returned to the place of purchase.

Safely prepare raw meat products, including fresh and frozen, and only consume ground beef that has been cooked to a temperature of **160°F**. Other cuts of beef should be cooked to a temperature of **145 °F** and allowed to rest for at least 3 minutes. Use a food thermometer that measures internal temperature, <http://1.usa.gov/1cDxcDQ>.
